## The Partnership Score Card

Through the end of March, 2010 the Partnership

- provided close to 30 assistance activities to area businesses
- responded to 24 prospects
- received \$25,000 in revenue
- coordinated 2 special events

- supported 4 pieces of legislation through letters, testimony and personal visits with legislators
- forged relationships with the bioscience community through developers, the life sciences and animal health
